Who is Eligible?

To be eligible for EHP, a student must be a citizen or national of the U.S. and be enrolled or accepted for enrollment at Fitchburg State University, and meet at least one of the following criteria*:

- Qualify as low-income according to Department of Education guidelines;
- Be a first-generation college student (neither parent has completed a four-year college degree); and/or
- Be a student with a disability.

*The Department of Education requires that approximately two-thirds of all students enrolled in the Expanding Horizons Program meet federal low-income guidelines. Because of this requirement, students may not be accepted to the program on a first-come, first-served basis. For more information, or to obtain an application online, please visit our webpage.
